Daniel E. Nordby is an attorney with the Tallahassee firm of Ausley McMullen, where his practice focuses on business litigation, constitutional law, and state administrative law with an emphasis on campaign/election law matters and agency rulemaking under the Florida Administrative Procedure Act. Daniel's practice encompasses both client counseling on regulatory issues and litigation before Florida's courts and administrative law judges.

In his election law practice, Daniel provides advice and counsel to political party committees and their officers, business entities, and candidates (state and federal) on various aspects of campaign finance and election law. He has litigated election law matters on behalf of the Republican National Committee, the Republican Party of Florida, and the Florida Department of State. Daniel has also represented clients in proceedings before the Florida Elections Commission, the Florida Commission on Ethics, and the Federal Election Commission.

Daniel served two terms as General Counsel to the Republican Party of Florida, including both the 2008 and 2010 general elections. In that role, he regularly provided counsel to RPOF officers and senior staff regarding the requirements of Florida's Election Code and its implementing rules, the Federal Election Campaign Act, the Bipartisan Campaign Reform Act of 2002 (McCain-Feingold) the Help America Vote Act of 2002 (HAVA), and the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA).

Daniel's background in government and administrative law includes service as a staff attorney on the Florida Legislature's Joint Administrative Procedures Committee and as Assistant General Counsel to the Florida Department of Education. In both public and private practice, Daniel has represented clients in a variety of administrative proceedings before the Division of Administrative Hearings, including bid protests and rule challenges. Daniel is an Executive Council member of the Florida Bar's Administrative Law Section.
